## Three Sask Indigenous-owned companies sign agreement to explore SMR opportunities

**Saskatoon, SK.** Kitsaki Management, Athabasca Basin Development, and Des Nedhe Group announced today that the three companies have signed an MOU to jointly pursue small modular reactor (SMR) investments.

“There is strong momentum in Canada towards novel nuclear reactor technologies that have the potential to supply power throughout the country, including remote or off-grid areas,” says Sean Willy, CEO of Des Nedhe Group. “As three Indigenous organizations who are highly experienced in servicing the nuclear industry, it made perfect sense for us to get together and jointly pursue exploring opportunities in this exciting and emerging industry.”

That experience stretches back to the 1980s and ‘90s and has provided significant economic and employment opportunities for the organizations and their regions. That success enabled further growth and diversification into other industries, such as insurance, retail, professional consulting, property management, and more, both in terms of investing and providing service.

“We have a long history of mutually beneficial relationships with uranium companies as well as many investments outside of uranium,” says Anne Robillard, Chair of Athabasca Basin Development. “Our collective experience makes us uniquely qualified to explore opportunities related to SMRs, from investment to construction, operation and maintenance.”

Collectively, the group has partnerships with over 40 Indigenous and non-Indigenous organizations across Canada. The group welcomes any Indigenous groups/entrepreneurs who are interested in learning and understanding this industry to reach out.

“We have worked together on investments in the past, and together, we make a formidable team,” says Russell Roberts, CEO of Kitsaki. “By signing this MOU, we plan to address key items for SMR investment, including research, due diligence, environmental, communications and financing. We are very open to discussion with interested parties and excited to be part of this group to invest in and further advance Canadian SMR technology.”
